State of the State Address



COSTS

- **MI Vehicle Rebate**: lower the cost of buying a new car by offering a \$1,000 rebate for cars and \$2,000 for electric vehicles. If assembled by a union, customers get an extra \$500—total of up to \$2,500 off at the point-of-sale.
- Housing: In 2024, make the largest investment to build housing in state history, totaling almost \$1.4 billion to build or rehabilitate nearly 10,000 homes. Build more of every kind of housing to expand supply and lower costs.
- Caring for MI Family Tax Credit: save families caring for an aging or sick relative up to \$5,000 on their taxes.

State of the State Address



EDUCATION

- **Pre-K for All**: last year, the Governor proposed Pre-K for All by the end of 2026, to save families \$10,000 a year. This year, the Governor's budget will propose pre-K for every single 4year-old in Michigan—2 years ahead of schedule.
- **Community College for All**: make the first two years of community college in Michigan tuition-free for every high school graduate, saving Michiganders an average of \$4,000 on tuition as they get their associates degree or skills certificate at a community college.

MAKING IT IN MICHIGAN

- Upgrade Michigan's bipartisan economic development toolkit to keep bringing supply chains and jobs home to Michigan.
- **R&D Tax Credit**: spur innovation while lowering costs for businesses.
- **HIRE Michigan**: to lower overall payroll taxes for small and second stage businesses—the more you hire here, the more you should save here.
- **Renaissance Zones**: to drive investment to areas that have too often been left out or left behind by lowering the cost of doing business.
- Innovation Fund: to invest in high-growth startups, help launch hundreds of new Michigan-based companies, creating thousands of jobs.
- **Roads**: The Governor called on the Michigan Department of Transportation to authorize the final \$700 million of the Rebuilding Michigan Plan.

Constitutional Amendment

- Prohibits property taxes
- Supermajority vote for tax increase
- Limited replacement revenue for limited purposes



Prohibits Property Taxes on Real Property

- No tax on real property after 2025
- No state or local alternative tax of real/personal property
- Eliminates all state & local school property taxes
- Eliminates property taxes on telephone/railroads
- Eliminates caps and limitations on taxes



Supermajority vote for tax increase

- Require 60% of voters to approve township, city, or countywide tax
- Require 2/3 vote of House & Senate to increase state revenue by more than 0.1% over 5 years



Limited Replacement Revenue for only cities, villages, townships & counties for limited purposes:

- "essential gov't services"
- "essential infrastructure services"

No Replacement Revenue For Any Other Purpose: schools, libraries, fire authorities, parks and recreation authorities, public transit authorities, etc.



Limited Replacement Revenue - Cities, Villages, and Townships

- Additional 5% of 4% of sales tax
- 10% of income tax
- 10% of taxes from alcohol, marijuana, tobacco taxes

Limited Replacement Revenue - Counties

- 10% of 4% of sales tax
- 10% of income tax
- 10% of taxes from alcohol, marijuana, tobacco taxes



Ballot Proposals - Citizens for Local Choice

Statutory Ballot Initiative

- Repeal Part 8 added by PA 233 of 2023
- Allow LUG to determine standards setbacks, heights, amount of light & sound emitted by energy facilities and exercise final authority over construction of energy facilities in their jurisdictions
