#### How many events are held in the City?

- The number of events that close City streets has varied from year to year, but average around 100 per year. Those on the larger end usually include events that may not happen on an annual basis. The recent University of Michigan Football Parade is an example of a last minute event that had to be presented to City Council quickly for approval—had the timing for a Council meeting not been prior to the Parade, the streets would have been closed administratively.
- For last minute events, the City Administrator or the Police Department have the authority to close the streets without Council approval for public safety.
- The Ann Arbor Art Fair was at one time considered a Special Event, but it has been approved by City Council as a City Ordinance.


